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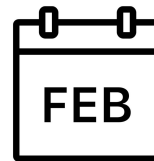

Waatea School Transport for 2023

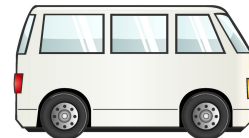
The start of 2023, transport will NOT be operating until Monday of Week 3, Term One. This gives us time to organise transport applications.

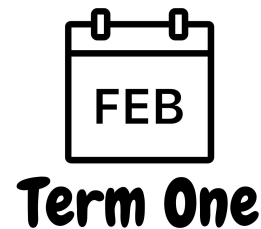
Stationery can be purchased by making a deposit into the following account. We do not hold or take cash. Stationery will not be required until Monday, Week 3 of Term One.

As per the conditions of enrolment, whānau are required to participate in termly whānau hui. Whānau hui will always be held on the third Wednesday of each term (Week 3).

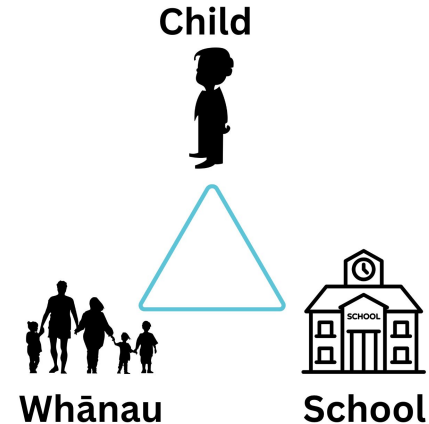
The first Whānau hui is scheduled for **Wednesday 22nd February 5pm** in Tangaroa. Each child **MUST** have a whānau representative attending the hui.

Whānau will be required to sign in for each hui. If whānau miss a hui, a follow up meeting will be arranged to discuss the implications of not attending.

Our strong belief is that for each child to reach their full potential there needs to be a tight triangle that includes student - whānau - school. This also aligns with our kura value - whanaungatanga.

Healthy Lunches & Food Policy 2023

A healthy food and drink environment helps support a young person's wellbeing/hauora, including their immediate physical and mental growth and development. It also helps establish positive behaviours for the future. Good nutrition can positively affect student behaviour, learning, concentration, and energy.

As whānau/caregivers, we ask you support us in the following:

- By not sending your child to school with lunches/snacks - The school provides morning tea and lunch and occasionally breakfast
- By not sending your child to school with lollies, sugary drinks, fizzy drinks, flavoured milk, bubblegum or packets of noodles - these will be confiscated and given back to the whānau at the end of the day.
- Support kaiako and your child by promoting healthier eating options when your child is at school. This could include joining in and having kai at school with your child, providing feedback on the lunches from FED, or completing a healthy eating community survey that is sent out every year.

Whānau are required to complete a healthy food agreement this year to ensure we are all supporting the positive changes that we would like to see at Waatea School. Please click on the link below to complete this form. Alternatively, a hard copy will be sent home in the new year.
